Our Scholarship Philosophy

At LEMO, we believe every athlete deserves the opportunity to learn, compete, and grow through club volleyball. Our scholarship program helps reduce financial barriers so more young people can experience those opportunities. We are committed to making the scholarship process fair, thoughtful, and respectful for every family.

How Scholarships Are Funded

Scholarships are funded entirely through philanthropy, including gifts from individual donors, foundations, corporate partners, fundraising activities, and other charitable support.

No athlete dues or membership fees are used to fund scholarships.

We are grateful to the donors whose generosity makes these opportunities possible.



Who Can Apply?

New and returning athletes seeking a roster position on an eligible LEMO Club Volleyball team may apply. Families requesting scholarship assistance must submit a completed application and all required documentation by the published deadline.

How the Process Works

Families interested in scholarship assistance apply as part of the tryout process. Applications are reviewed while teams are being formed so that scholarship awards are communicated at the same time as roster offers. This allows families to make an informed decision before committing to the season.

How Awards Are Determined

Scholarship awards are determined using the following factors:

- Demonstrated financial need
- Information provided in the application
- Available scholarship funding

Because scholarship funding is limited, submitting an application does not guarantee scholarship assistance or the full amount requested. Most awards are partial scholarships so LEMO can assist as many qualified athletes as possible while responsibly managing the philanthropic resources entrusted to the program.

Our Partnership

Athletes receiving scholarship assistance, together with their families, are important members of the LEMO community. As part of receiving scholarship assistance, athletes and their families are expected to:

- Honor team commitments
- Demonstrate good sportsmanship
- Remain in good standing with the club
- Complete the volunteer commitment established for the season



Volunteer hours may be completed by the athlete, a parent, or a guardian. Volunteering strengthens the LEMO community and helps create opportunities for future athletes.

Renewal

Scholarship awards apply only to the current club season and are not automatically renewed. Families needing scholarship assistance for a future season must submit a new application.

Our Commitment to Families

Applying for scholarship assistance is a personal decision. We are committed to treating every family with dignity, respect, and confidentiality. We also work to make the application process straightforward, supportive, and easy to understand.

Confidentiality

Scholarship applications are reviewed confidentially by designated scholarship reviewers. Financial information is shared only with those responsible for administering the program.
